USED FIRE TRUCK

The old 1977 Pierce Engine was replaced by a 1987 Pierce Lance custom pumper from Central Bridge, NY. This newer truck is automatic, making it easier to drive than the old standard one. It has a 1500 gpm top mount pump, rear suction and 2 ½" discharge, a poly tank, 30 gal class B foam and more storage. Rich Powell lettered Windham's name on it and added some graphics also. After getting the original title from New York changed to PA and new tires on it, they conducted a training session. On Feb. 28 by the Twin Ponds along Route 187, thirteen fire members were present to learn how to use the pump. The truck was put in service on March 5, 2018.

RABIES CLINIC

For many years the Windham Twp. Vol. Fire Co. has conducted a rabies clinic each spring where your cat or dog can get a rabies shot for a minimal fee. The Endless Mountains Veterinary Center supplies the doctor and donates their time. One or three year vaccinations are given depending on the shot records that are provided that day. This year the clinic was held on March 26, 2018 from 5 to 6 PM at the station; a total of 36 animals received their rabies vaccinations.

GENERATOR

The Brickhouse Services of Laceyville, PA installed a Generac generator at the Windham Firehouse on November 30th. This will keep the station open when there are power outages in the area. The 16 KW standby generator will turn on automatically if there is a power outage.
